Professor Harry G Kennedy

Prof Harry G Kennedy is Professor of Forensic Psychiatry at Trinity College Dublin, Ireland; Skou Professor of Forensic Psychiatry Aarhus University, Denmark; Visiting Professor of Forensic Psychiatry University of Bari Aldo Moro, Italy. Invited expert Committee for Prevention of Torture, inhuman and degrading treatment, Council of Europe; Invited expert International Criminal Court, The Hague.

Professor Felice Carabellese

Prof Felice Carabellese is full Professor of Forensic Psychiatry and Legal Medicine, University of Bari Aldo Moro Italy; Visiting Professor at Trinity College University of Dublin, Scientific Consultant Metropolis Forensic Psychiatry activities, SIPRiFo President. Prof Carabellese's research interests includes evaluation of Forensic Mental Health Services in Italy, psychopathy in female offenders, mafia's men and women assessment, psychopathological assessment and mental capacity, severe mental disorder and homicides.
